The owner of any horse, who is held to be responsible for any injuries, shall indemnify NWSHBA against all claims and demands of any kind or nature that may grow from negligence of the person in charge of any such horse. All horses exhibited in the shows will be entirely at the owner's sole risk.

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the advanced level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30.00 non-member registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk/trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA endorsed Reining Competitions. Also exempted from this requirement are citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 8) USEA beginner novice division; and 9) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. (See GR807.4 of the Federation rules.)

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a US Equestrian Federation licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider or Handler and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents. I agree that I am subject to the Constitution and Rules of US Equestrian Federation and the local rules of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 1502.5.

MEMBERSHIP AFFIDAVIT FEE: Is no longer Available - YOU MUST PRESENT YOUR CARD OR COPY- All participants (rider, driver, handler, owner, trainer, agent or lessee) must present to the competition secretary a current US Equestrian Federation membership card or copy thereof. In the event a participant does not have his/her card or copy, he/she must pay the \$30.00 non-member fee pursuant to US Equestrian Federation rules. **IF A PERSON IS A NON-MEMBER, THEY MUST PAY THE \$30.00 NON-MEMBER FEE.**

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION NON-MEMBER/AMATEUR CERTIFICATION: Any exhibitor who wishes to compete at these competitions must be a member of US Equestrian Federation or pay a non-member fee. All persons entering classes restricted to amateurs (adults 18 and over) must present proof of amateur certification issued by the US Equestrian Federation; non-members who require amateur certification must file a non-member amateur application and pay a \$30.00 fee and a \$30.00 non-member fee

USDF Non-Member Fee Increase in **2011**

At the 2009 Adequan/USDF Annual Convention, a USDF Non-Member fee increase was passed, effective for the 2011

competition year. Effective October 1, 2010, the USDF Non-Member fee will increase from \$20 to \$25.

Closing of PRE Entries: Pre Entries close August 10, 2010. Entries are accepted with a late fee charge after postmark of August 10th.

Post Entries, Substitutions and Transfers: Post entries are accepted up until 2 classes prior to the class being entered .Post entries, substitutions, and transfers will be accepted at base cost plus an office charge of \$10 per class.

Cancellation of entries, payments and refunds: Entries canceling until closing date all fees less 30.00 shall be refunded . Exhibitors canceling entries after the closing date shall forfeit their entry fees. Membership Cards: Attention, Competitors each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, USEF, USHJA ODS, owner, rider/driver/handler, trainer, and coach before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards. A USEF/USHJA membership is REQUIRED for the Zone Nine Hunter Breeding Finals. A current Equine Canada membership allows eligibility for USEF membership without a Non Member Fee for all classes except the Zone Nine Finals.

Awards: A first place award and placing to fifth place.

Stabling: Permanent box stalls with half doors provided. Bedding will be provided. Stalls will be available for occupancy at 1:00 pm on Thursday day and must be vacated no later than midnight Sunday. Fee for box stalls and tack stalls for the entire three days shall be \$80.00 each. If you require a stall for one day it will be 45.00 a day and must be vacated by 8 am the next day. No refund of stall fees unless requested directly to the show secretary before August 20, 2010. TOP Door Stalls are only available on outside Rows. Any damage to the stalls shall be billed to the exhibitor.

Footing: All arenas are sand based. The inside arena is 100 by 200 with a solid wall. Outside warm up is 80 by 100 with a post and rail fence. One additional warm up area is available all sand with a chain link barrier and is 200 by 90.

Food: A hospitality area is provided for Exhibitors with a hosted dinner Saturday Evening. A snack bar is open during show hours.

Returned Checks: There will be a \$30 penalty per check returned by the bank FOR ANY REASON. No checks will be processed through the bank a second time. To retain entries, the fees and penalty must be paid by money order, cashiers check, or cash before 4:00 pm the day before the horse show starts. In event a check is returned after the competition of the show, it will be handled in accordance with USEF Rules.

USEF Drug Fee: For every horse participating in any competition recognized by USEF, a \$15 fee will be collected (\$7 shall be a Drug and Medication fee to provide research, inspection, and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs; see article GR301.6 and GR1401.12 and \$8.00 to USEF)

Management: Management reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes that do not fill to their satisfaction, except hunter breeding. Show management reserves the right to limit entries, add or divide classes, to add or substitute judges, or to make any other changes required by circumstances to the competition listed herein. Entries will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis per USEF. Show management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or amend classes and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by show management. Horses not entered in the show can only be brought to the show at the discretion of show management. Other than at their scheduled times, competitors are only allowed near or in the show arena at the discretion of the show management.

Horse Show Office: Show office hours are: Thursday 2 PM until 7 PM; Stall charts will be posted on the office door for late arrivals. Show office hours: Friday 12 until end of Show, Saturday 8:00 AM until close of show and Sunday 7:30 AM until close of show. The number to reach the office is 253 846-1610.

Trailer and Camper Hook Ups: Hookups are available at \$20 per night. There will be a \$10 charge per night for trailers and campers that park overnight and do not use hookups. Any trailer parked in a camper hookup area around the barn WILL BE CHARGED a camping fee. You will be issued a camping/parking permit for the duration of the show to be displayed in a visible area on your trailer or camper. If you do not obtain a permit, you will be fined.

HANDLERS: Please note the following rule change has been approved and is in effect as of March 1, 2005 for USDF-recognized Dressage Sport Horse Breeding divisions and competitions: DR205. Entries [Chapter DR. Dressage Division. SubChapter DR-2, Dressage Sport Horse Breeding.] Any and all handlers (including Assistant Handlers) of horses in the competition ring are required to sign an entry blank (see GR1502.2) Handlers must be Federation members or pay a non-member fee. Assistant Handlers need not be Federation members and are exempted from the non-member fee. All handlers and assistant handlers entering the competition ring must be identified by show management with a wristband or other form of identification to ensure each individual has signed an entry form and/or separate handler/assistant handler release form. Competition areas must be monitored by ring stewards to ensure that only eligible handlers and assistant handlers are permitted to enter the arena. Judges must excuse horses with handlers and/or assistant handlers who are not properly identified. For purposes of this rule, a "safety officer" is any individual appointed by competition management to assist in the enforcement of this rule. The Handler release form is available on the Dressage page of the Federation website, www.usef.org.

Haul Ins: There will be a charge of \$15 a day for horses not stabled at the show.

Attire: All exhibitors/handlers are asked to dress appropriately. Conservative sports attire is recommended.

High Score Oldenburg - Sponsor ISR/NA OLD Awarded to the high scoring ISR or OLD NA registered horses in the Open In Hand Classes. IBC and Group Classes not to count. To be eligible for this award the must be registered with the ISR Oldenburg NA registry. Foals, which have no documentation but will be presented in 2009, are eligible.

American Warmblood Society

The AWS awards offered at your show will be:

Sat. Sept 4, 2009 1 set of small medals (Gold, Silver & Bronze) to the top 3 scoring AWS qualifying* horses for all In-Hand Classes 5 thru 8, 10 thru 13 & 15 thru 17 (regardless of age).

Sat. Sept 4, 2009 1 set of small medals (Gold, Silver & Bronze) to the top 3 scoring AWS qualifying* horses in Class 30 (AWS IBC).

Sun. Sept 5, 2009 1 set of small medals (Gold, Silver & Bronze) to the top 3 scoring AWS qualifying* horses for all Classes 105 thru 108, 110 thru 113 & 115 thru 117 (regardless of age).

Sun. Sept 5, 2009 1 set of Large medals (Gold, Silver & Bronze) to the top 3 scoring AWS qualifying* horses for all Classes 126 thru 129 (regardless of age).

*AWS Qualifying denotes owners that are current AWS members and the horse is current in the AWS 2009 Awards Program. AWS will be responsible for the qualifying of the AWS entries

Method of showing Triangle: The triangle will be used for all Dressage Sporthorse In Hand Classes. Horses shall be judged “in hand” and shown on the triangle. Entries in each class shall approach the judge one at a time. Each handler will walk the horse to the apex of the triangle. At the judge’s request, the handler with horse in hand, will perform first at a walk along the perimeter of the smaller triangle, then trot along the perimeter of the larger triangle, ending at the apex of the triangle where the horse is to be set up for the conformation judging. The judge shall view each animal from the front, both sides and from the rear. NOTE: Conformation judging may be done either at the beginning and/or finish at the discretion of the judge. The handler leads from the left (near side) of the horse and moves clockwise around the triangle at both the walk and trot as designated. When all horses have been judged in this manner a select number may be recalled for final comparison and/or tie breaking. Weanlings may NOT be shown loose.

Championship Classes: The first and second place ribbon winners are eligible to compete in their respective divisions. Should any first and second place winner in a qualifying class not compete for the Championship or be disqualified for being unsound, unruly, or not performing the class routine in the Championship class, the horse receiving the next highest ribbon in the qualifying class shall have the option of moving up for the Championship and Reserve only.

Dressage Sporthorse Prospects and Dressage Breeding Stock

This is a Qualifying event for the USDFB Breeders Championship 2010 Series. Classes are recognized by the USDF, ODS and NWSBA for annual awards. Membership and horse recording is required prior to entering the class for points to count. Classes conducted according to USEF Chapter II, Rule XIX. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar of these rules. Horses to be judged per article 1936.1. Weanlings may NOT be shown loose with the mare at side. Sporthorses will be evaluated on the yellow USDF Dressage Sporthorse Prospect in Hand and Breeding Stock will be evaluated on the pink USDF Sporthorse Breeding Stock score sheets. For more information visit the USDF website.

Horses named champion and reserve in the classes listed below are eligible to compete in the USDF Series Finals offered at this show. Horses must have a lifetime registration with USDF to compete in the finals.

Dressage Type Sporthorse, Champion and Reserve Stallions 4 yrs & older-*Northwest Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders’ Series Qualifier*

Dressage Type Sporthorse, Champion and Reserve Colt and Gelding- *Northwest Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders’ Series Qualifier*

Dressage Type Sporthorse, Champion and Reserve Fillies – *Northwest Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders’ Series Qualifier*

Dressage Type Sporthorse, Champion and Reserve Mature Mares – *Northwest Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Series Qualifier*

In hand classes shall be judged at the walk and trot and standing for conformation. Weakness or confirmation faults with a predisposition to unsoundness or to difficulties in training shall be penalized. A horse shall be disqualified for any unsoundness at the judges discretion. Blemishes are not to count unless resulting from conformation faults. Conformation is to be evaluated in terms of potential trainability, potential performance; function, not fashion, is to be emphasized. Gaits are to be evaluated in terms of purity, quality, and correctness. In championship classes the judge(s) may line up the horses in the order of his/her placing with no actual score awarded in that class.

Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series

40.00 Entry Fee

Horses must have qualified at this show or at a previous show, which held a qualifying event in this series. In order to compete in the finals a horse must be registered with the USDF and the owner must be a current USDF participating or business member. Verification of membership and the USDF Horse Registration must be provided to the management prior to competing in a series final class. Since a qualifier is held at this show the management must collect USDF Lifetime Registration and/or participating or business membership forms for ineligible entries that wish to participate in the series finals class. In addition to a champion and reserve being awarded in the finals each class will be placed to sixth and finals ribbons awarded. See the USDF qualifier pages included in the prize list for further information. Two judges will officiate. Each judge will evaluate each entry independently, scribes will be provided for each judge. Winners determined by the average score of the judges. The highest scoring horse will be declared the Champion and the second highest Reserve Champion. Scores for the series final will be published separately in addition to the overall average. Horses must be individually shown on the triangle at the walk and trot, and will stand for conformation. Each horse will be evaluated in the same manner. Callbacks are permitted.

Northwest Breeders Irish Draught Dressage Championship

Earn 62% in any USEF/USDF recognized Open Competition In Hand Breeders Classes

Place 1-2 in any of the Irish Draught Classes in the NWSHBA Classic or any USDF Breed Class at a show in Oregon or Washington in the current year.

Horses must have qualified at this show or at a previous show, which held a qualifying event in this series. In order to compete in the finals a horse must be registered with the USDF and the owner must be a current USDF participating or business member. Verification of membership and the USDF Horse Registration must be provided to the management prior to competing in a series final class. Two judges will officiate. Each judge will evaluate each entry independently, scribes will be provided for each judge. Winners determined by the average score of the judges. The highest scoring horse will be declared the Champion and the second highest Reserve Champion. Scores for the series final will be published separately in addition to the overall average. Horses must be individually shown on the triangle at the walk and trot, and will stand for conformation. Each horse will be evaluated in the same manner. Callbacks are permitted.

Dressage Sporthorse Prospect in Hand

Classes shall be judged in hand at the walk and trot, and standing for conformation. Horses will be judged 60% movement, 30% conformation, and 10% general impression including impulsion, balance, and ratability if under saddle. The current USDF score sheets will be used.

Dressage Sporthorse Breeding in Hand

Classes shall be judged on 50% movement, 40% conformation, and 10% general impression including masculinity if a stallion, femininity if a mare. Weakness or predisposition to unsoundness shall be penalized, commensurate with the severity. The current USDF Score Sheets will be used.

Dressage Materiale Classes-\$30.00

The classes shall be judged according to the USEF rule book Reference DR120- Materiale Class The current USDF Materiale Score Sheets will be used

Individual Breed Classes

For the individual breed classes, horse and owner may need to be registered/member of respective organizations for additional awards. To be judged according to breed standards. Geldings of any age are eligible to compete. Breed Classes will use the USDF Sport Horse Prospect score sheet. Proof of registration must be included with entry.

Irish Draught Partbreds

Shall be open to horse that can prove ¼ Irish Draught parentage.

Made In America Class

The purpose of this class is to recognize Breeders who breed American and to promote horses bred and born in the USA. To qualify for entry into the “Made In America” Classes, the entry horse must have been foaled in the USA **and** both of his parents must have been foaled in the USA. With horse’s entry, please provide proof that shows **sire, dam, & entry** were foaled in the USA

Hunter Breeding. HU 184 [Chapter HU. Hunter Division] Effective 4/1/09:

Breeding classes are judged on conformation, way of moving, quality, substance, soundness and suitability to become or in the case of sires and dams apparent ability to produce or beget hunters. Possible inheritable conformational defects are only to be considered in the case of sires and dams or prospective sires and dams. Horses are to be judged for conformation before being walked and/or **trotted**. Broodmares and weanlings are to walk. Yearlings, Two year-olds and Three year-olds are to walk and **trot**. Horses that are not sound are ineligible for an award. If the section has only one judge and thus one set of points, the entries should be lined up in the order of preference before the ribbons are pinned. If this is a two-judge section, with two sets of points, the entries are not lined up in the order of preference until both judges have turned in their cards. The announcer or ringmaster will line up Judge #1’s entries in his/her order of preference before awarding the ribbons. After the entries have been pinned for the first judge, Judge #2’s entries will line up in his/her order of preference before the awarding of ribbons.

b. Foals in breeding classes may wear leather halters. All animals of yearling status and older must be shown in a bridle. Only a snaffle or straight bar bit may be used. A properly fitted in hand leather lead and chain, such as a new market or “V” shank type may be substituted for reins. A properly fitted in hand leather lead may also be substituted for reins. A properly fitted chain should be short enough to prevent the horse from getting it in his/her mouth and should never be placed over the nose or tightly under the chin.

IRISH DRAUGHT BREED (HUNTERS)

The class(es) shall be restricted to Irish Draught and Irish Draught Sporthorses, of at least 1/4 proven Approved Registered Irish Draught (RID) parentage. Horses shall be required to be either

A: registered with the Irish Draught Horse Society of North America, and/or the Irish Draught Horse Society of Canada, or another Daughter Society of the Irish Draught Horse Society (Ireland), or

B: to be eligible for registration with one or more of the above entities. Proof of registration or eligibility (ie, photocopies of registration papers or of registration application, if pending) will be required for entry.

Eligibility is to be determined per the Registration Policies of IDHSNA and/or IDHS Canada. (See attached Registration Policies)

Judges are to judge all horses entered in the class in accordance with the Breed Standard as to their conformation (40%), temperament (30%) and way of going (30%), as published and adhered to by IDHS Ireland and its Daughter Societies.

Horses shall be shown “on the line” as for a Hunter Breeding In-Hand class. Foals may be shown at foot with their dams, dams not to be judged unless they are entered as a separate entry. Foals are not to be shown loose, they must be haltered and shown on a lead by a separate handler. Yearlings may be shown in halter with or without chifney, or in a bridle. Horse two years of age and older must be shown in a bridle, with either an in-hand lead or reins. Braiding is traditional and is to be encouraged. Class may be split as to gender or age if entries warrant such.

All horses in each class are to enter the ring at a walk to be presented before the judge for inspection. Horse will be stood up square for this inspection. Horses will then be asked to walk away from and back to the judge, then to trot away and back to the judge. The walk should be long reaching, straight and fluid. The hind feet should track up well. The trot shall be free and elastic, without exaggerated action of the leg or hoof, and shall be smooth and straight. The horse shall then be stood up for final inspection before being dismissed to the line. Horses are to be lined up head to tail to await the judge’s placing. The judge may ask each entrant to walk and trot the perimeter of the ring in order before finalizing his or her placing. Judges are encouraged to familiarize themselves with the Breed Standard before viewing their class.
